Council Sets Priorities for 2007

In May 2006, the City Council embarked on an ambitious process to develop a Strategic Plan to give guidance to staff on their vision and priorities for the City. This past February, another planning session was held to enable the newly elected City Council the opportunity to provide input into the Strategic Plan so that it may reflect their values and priorities as well.

Plans are important. Why? If you don't have a plan, you won't know the direction you are going. If you have ever taken a trip, then you know the value of having a map or a plan. A map gives you direction, provides markers along your route, and lets you know when you have arrived at your destination.

The City's Strategic Plan is just such a map; it is a document that provides a destination of where the City Council wants to go with specific priority goals and objectives to achieve along the way.

In creating a Strategic Plan, the Council established a vision statement that reads: "Goleta

remains a beautiful and safe small town community, with family-friendly neighborhoods, that values the environment, agriculture, and open space while providing diverse housing, recreation and business opportunities." Using the vision statement as a foundation, the Council then developed 13 main goals (*see below*) and over 140 objectives designed to get to our destination.

In February, the City Council began the process of prioritizing the objectives that they would like to see reflected in the budget process and in City Department Work Plans. Since this Plan is very comprehensive, it would be impossible for the City to embark with equal effort on every goal in the document. Therefore, City Staff is currently evaluating the results of this prioritization process and will bring back before Council a timeline to initiate many of the Council's priorities in 2007.

We welcome input from residents on our Strategic Plan.

Goleta Celebrates National Public Works Week

There are hard workers behind the scenes every day to keep the City running smoothly, and many of these people are Public Works Employees. These folks patch the streets, repair the sidewalks, keep the City clean, endure the rain to clear debris from storm drains, maintain public recreation areas, care for our street medians, trim street trees and shrubs, and perform numerous other tasks that make our City a better and safer place to live.

See a Pothole? Debris in the Road?

Residents now have one simple number to call to report the locations that need street or sidewalk repairs. Residents can call 24 hours a day. The messages are retrieved at least twice daily.

Residents who call this line should be prepared with:

- The nearest street address or cross street to the needed repair. The more information that is provided, the more efficiently the request can be attended to.
- Your name and number if you wish to be contacted about the repair.

Problems with traffic signals or stop signs may impose a safety hazard, and people reporting such items should call the Public Works Streets Manager directly at 961.7571 for immediate attention.

Pouring Concrete Around the City

In mid April, the City's annual concrete repair program will kick-off. In the last three years, over 1,130 concrete sites have been repaired and 117 access ramps have been installed. That is a whole lot of concrete!

This year, the City will see concrete repair at over 250 separate locations and on 93 City Streets. Access ramps will be installed, and sidewalks, curbs and gutters, and residential driveway approaches will be repaired.

New Sidewalks for Hollister Avenue

The City is installing missing sidewalks around Hollister Avenue near Storke Road and Phelps Road in order to enhance accessibility throughout this heavily traveled corridor. The City opted to install a narrower sidewalk so more linear feet of sidewalk could be installed, while still meeting Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Funds for this work come from the Regional State Transportation Program.

As development projects are approved along the Hollister Avenue corridor, more landscaping and wider sidewalks will be installed.

Celebrate Local Earth Day Events

Did you know that Santa Barbara County is the birthplace of Earth Day? It is rumored that after **Senator Gaylord Nelson** visited here in 1969, just after the oil spill, the idea to have a day to celebrate and learn about the Earth's resources was born. In our corner of the world, we have two days to celebrate Earth Day.

On **April 14**, the **Goleta Family School** holds an Earth Day event at Stow Park in Goleta from 11 am – 4 pm. There will be music, games, vendors, and other activities. It is fun for people of all ages.

On **April 22**, **South Coast Earth Day Festival** will take place at the Santa Barbara County Courthouse Sunken Gardens from 1 pm to 5:30 pm. The theme, "**Global Warming: Change Begins with Learning**," takes a timely look at climate change through both scientific and artistic lenses. The festival will emphasize personal and community action with displays of renewable energy technologies, conservation techniques, and advanced-fuel vehicles. This event is sponsored by the **Community Environmental Council** and the **UCSB Bren School of Environmental Science and Management**.

All day on Sunday, April 22, every Santa Barbara MTD bus and electric shuttle will be FREE, anywhere to anywhere.



Snowy Plover Comes to Nest

Snowy Plovers, a federally protected endangered species, are nesting at the beach below Ellwood Mesa and the Coal Oil Point "Sands" beach. The nesting season begins in early March and ends in late September. The City asks residents to please respect the snowy plover's nesting grounds by following posted signs and by picking up litter. Trash attracts crows that prey on the snowy plovers. Thank you.

Recycling Resource Guide for Santa Barbara County Now Available

The **Recycling Resource Guide for Santa Barbara County** provides useful information and resources to help consumers and organizations learn how to prevent the creation of waste and to reuse or recycle the materials that they have used.

For example, the Guide contains information on places that accept materials to be reused or recycled, recycling drop-off and buy-back centers, tips to stop receiving junk mail, a composting/mulch program, hazardous waste facilities, and used motor oil collection centers.

Flex Your Power

Get a Polluter Off the Road

This spring, the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) launched an **Old Car Buy-Back Program**, offering \$800 for cars, light-duty trucks, and (vans model year 1988) or older that are registered in Santa Barbara County and meet certain requirements.

Cars and trucks are the major source of onshore smog pollution in Santa Barbara County. Older vehicles can pollute 20-30 times more than newer ones. These higher-polluting vehicles make up only a small percent of those on the road, but produce a very large percentage of the vehicle pollution. The APCD program is designed to take these polluting vehicles off the road permanently by using a licensed auto dismantler to destroy cars and trucks voluntarily retired under this program.

The program currently has enough funding to buy back and retire more than 200 vehicles. The vehicle must be operable and registered in Santa Barbara County (for at least the last two years). Additional requirements may apply. Be a part of this important opportunity to improve our air quality!

Gardening Tips from a Guru


Spring in the Good Land is a great time to be outside and dig in the dirt. The *Monarch Press* asked **Bill Miller**, the City's Parks and Recreation Manager, for some good tips for the intrepid gardener or even the seasoned professional.

"Now that we have spent the winter pruning trees and roses, it is time to design your garden. The area will need to be cleaned and mulched. It is a great time to visit local nurseries to see what is available and what is coming soon."

For the novice gardener, I always recommend starting small and adding on as you go. Radishes are an excellent first crop for most people, as are zucchini, squash, snap beans, and eggplant.

Think about how much time you have to spend in your garden before you bury yourself in too much work. Also, you don't need a lot of space to enjoy gardening. Container gardens can be a great way to garden while still getting your hands dirty."



Spring Safety Tip from the City of Goleta Police....

I see a lot of people not wearing bicycle helmets. Isn't this against the law?

Well, yes and no. Any person under 18 years of age must wear an approved bicycle helmet. The term "bicycle" also includes skateboards, scooters, skates or basically anything with wheels. Riders over 18 years of age are not required to wear a helmet, however, it is strongly suggested they do.

City Council Sets Up Process to Review General Plan

In early March, the City Council voted to establish a process to revisit certain aspects of the City's **General Plan**. A General Plan is a blueprint for the community which provides a statement of aspirations for the City. It is meant to be refined, changed, and updated based upon the changing needs of the community.

While the City's General Plan is just over 150 days old, the City Council is interested in considering changes to the Plan so that it reflects a philosophy of flexibility and general standards as opposed to rigid and specific standards. The General Plan Amendment Initiation Hearing will be held on April 16, 2007 at 6 pm.

Mobile Home Residents to Receive FREE Energy Efficiency Products

Starting in June, the **South Coast Energy Efficiency Partnership**, of which the City of Goleta is a partner, is unveiling an energy efficiency program for all mobile home residents. Any mobile home in the South Coast that is a Southern California Edison customer, is eligible for free energy efficiency products and services such as interior and exterior lighting, low flow showerheads, testing for and sealing of leaks in your heating and air conditioning ducts and tune-up of your central air conditioning unit.

In May, a letter will be sent to all mobile home residents describing the program in detail. Following that, an "open house" will be held at each mobile home park with the park's manager to learn more. Residents will be able to meet the contractors from Synergy Companies, who are contracted to do the work, and schedule an appointment.


