Purpose of the Environmental Hearing Officer Meeting


- Inform the community and agencies about the project and environmental review process
- Receive comments from the public and agencies on the Revised Draft EIR

Project History

- Original Draft EIR circulated for public review in June 2016
- Environmental Hearing Officer meeting in July 2016 to receive verbal public comments on the Draft EIR
- Administrative Draft Final EIR completed in 2018 but not certified by the City
- Revised Draft EIR prepared to address project design changes
- Revised Draft EIR circulated for 45-day public review period on May 14, 2021

Project Site


 17.36 acre vacant site north of Camino Vista and east of S. Los Carneros Rd



Currently Proposed Project

- 332 units (228 market rate and 104 senior and family supportive affordable units)
- 2-acre park
- General Plan Amendment to remove Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Area (ESHA) designation
- Vesting Tentative Tract Map and Development Plan
- Streamside Protection Area (SPA) buffer reduction
- Vacation of a portion of Los Carneros Road right-of-way

Site Plan



Project Changes Since 2016 Draft EIR

- Reduction in number of units (360 to 332 units)
- Change in architectural style and height reduction
- Increased right-of-way along Los Carneros Road
- Building setback shift along Los Carneros Road
- Request for a SPA buffer reduction of up to 33 feet
 - A 67-foot buffer would be provided from the edge of riparian vegetation in the northeast corner of the project site
- Merger of 13 lots into 4 lots (instead of 3 lots)

SPA Buffer Reduction HERITAGE RIDGE 16.04 acres = Project Site No Impact to SPA Setback: 15.82 acres or 98.68% (approx.) = Landscape Area Inside of SPA Setback: 0.11 acre or 0.66% (approx.) = Drive Aisle Inside of SPA Setback: 0.11 acre or 0.66% (approx.)


CEQA Overview

- The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) is the State's primary environmental protection law
- CEQA requires that public agencies disclose environmental impacts of project that have a physical effect on the environment
- An EIR is an informational document
 - Discloses information about effects a proposed project could have on the environment
 - Identifies mitigation measures
 - Describes feasible alternatives to the proposed project
 - Must be certified prior to project approval

What is an EIR?

An Information Document

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Lead Agency prepares findings on the feasibility of reducing significant environmental effects Lead Agency certifies Final EIR Lead Agency makes a decision on the project Lead Agency files Notice of Determination with State Clearinghouse and County Clerk Responsible agency decision-making bodies consider the Final EIR and make findings prior to making their decisions and filing Notices of Determination

Revised Draft EIR

- An EIR requires recirculation if:
 - Significant new information is added
 - New significant impacts or mitigation measures are identified
 - The severity of an impact increases
- Portions of the Draft EIR were recirculated to reflect:
 - Project design changes
 - New regulatory requirements
 - Updated CEQA guidelines
 - Changes to environmental and cumulative setting

EIR Summary (Significant Unavoidable Impacts)

- Cultural resources (cumulative)
- Noise (short construction noise impacts)
- Utilities and service systems (solid waste project and cumulative)

EIR Summary (Potentially Significant, but Mitigable Impacts)

- Aesthetics and visual resources (building heights/massing compatibility & lighting)
- Air quality (exposure of sensitive receptors)
- Biological resources (nesting/foraging birds, indirect habitat impacts/wildlife linkage)
- Cultural resources (impacts on Native American Site #CA-SBA-56)
- Geology and soils (liquefaction potential, expansive and erodible soils)
- Hydrology and water quality (alteration of drainage patterns/increased impermeability)
