CLEANUP SAFETY

Please stick to sidewalks when conducting cleanups in neighborhoods, and stick to City property when doing cleanups in parks or open spaces!

- Do not trespass onto private property or conduct cleanup activities in streets and roads.
- Do not direct or interfere with traffic.

VOLUNTEER SAFETY COMES FIRST!

- Follow CDC and County guidelines for masks and social distancing protocols.
- WATCH YOUR STEP! The most common cause of outdoor injuries are slips, trips, and falls.
- Wear sun protective clothing and use sunscreen if possible.
- Bring water stay hydrated!
- Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) such as gloves, sturdy closed-toe shoes, and any other PPE needed for hazards in your cleanup area.
- Use situational awareness be aware of your surroundings and all potential hazards associated with them (like moving cars, poison ivy, tides, and uneven ground).
- Use the buddy system work in teams of at least two.
- Children must always have adult supervision.

Hazardous materials (notify the event coordinator)

- Dead animals
- Medication/controlled substances
- Syringes, needles, sharp objects
- Hazardous chemicals
