## CITY COUNCIL STUDY SESSION FOR THE TRACK 1 HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE

The Goleta City Council will conduct a study session to review an update of the Housing Element of the Goleta General Plan / Coastal Land Use Plan. The update includes amendments to the element and technical appendix that address:

- Public Comment, Written and Oral
- Implementation Effectiveness from 2006-2007
- Consistency with Other General Plan Elements
- Regional Housing Needs Allocation for 2007-2014

Specific key policy issues that will be reviewed include affordable housing inclusionary requirements, rental versus owner affordable housing strategies, covenant terms for affordable units, emergency shelter and transitional housing requirements, energy conservation strategies, and more. *No approval of potential future amendments will be taken at this public meeting.*
