Business within the City of Goleta

All businesses (with a few exceptions) are required to have a business license, which must be renewed annually.

What is a Business License?

The carrying out of any business, trade, calling, profession or occupation requires a business license. This includes fixed businesses, transient business (carts, door-to-door sales), home-based businesses, and out of town businesses such as contractors and construction companies. Anyone doing business within City limits is required to have a business license.

Examples include: All storefronts (brick and mortar), Builders/Contractors, Consultants, Online Business. Non-profits do not need to pay for a license, but they do need to register via the General Business License.

In addition to obtaining a city business license, there are State and County filing requirements when opening a business.

Determine a Business Name

The name you choose for your business is important. Aside from making sure that the name clearly describes your business, you need to ensure that the name is not already being used. If the name you choose is anything other than your own legal name, you are required to file a fictitious business name statement. The statement is filed with the County of Santa Barbara Clerk and Recorder's Office.
